SUMMARY

Report on the activities of the Professional and Legal Committee.

1. INTRODUCTION

1.1. The following is a review of the activities and membership of the IFATCA professional and Legal Committee for the years 2023 – 2024.

2. MEMBERSHIP

- 2.1. The following member associations (Mass) were elected to the IFATCA professional and Legal committee (PLC) in 2023 at the IFATCA Annual Conference in Jamaica: Italy, Netherlands, Israel, Romania, Japan, Australia, Kenya, Slovenia, Greece, USA, Jamaica and Bulgaria.
- 2.2. Several Mas also supported the PLC by funding attendance of Corresponding Members at our meetings. These compromised: EGATS, Poland, Dominican Republic and Belgium.
- 2.3. We had multiple topics that spanned the technical and the professional side and as such we work a lot with the TOC to produce joint papers for this years conference.
